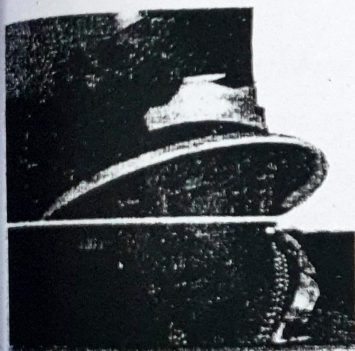
Bill Gates
